



Code of conduct

Each Euroglide we are surprised by the hospitality of the fields and aeroclubs we visit. We prefer to keep it that way. In the past some incidents have occurred. Because of the growing number of participants over the years, the number of teams visiting an airfield for a night stay and launch also increased. For large groups, things are more likely to escalate. Listed here are a number of basic rules that everyone says are obvious, but apparently have not always been.

- The hospitality of most airfields is outstanding. Let's keep it that way.
- You are an uninvited guest, behave as such.
- Ask for the local (flying) rules and stick to them.
- Agree on driving routes on the airfield, parking of cars and gliders, rigging, the overnight stay (tents, camper, clubhouse), the use of electricity, toilettes and douches.
- When you arrive on an airfield, ask other teams that arrived before you what has been agreed already.
- For larger groups it is useful to appoint a group representative.
- Speak up if you believe others misbehave.
- Hospitality has its limits. Do not ask too much.
- Clean up the mess and don't think other teams will do that. Take your responsibility.
- If the use of the facilities is free, do a donation anyway.
- Say thanks to the hospitable aeroclub before you leave.
- Do not leave without donating or attaching a Euroglide sticker!
